All pupils will attend the Careers Day and the **Careers Fair**. Additional events will take place throughout the year to engage pupils with a range of training, apprenticeship, career and university providers. Such events will include **careers talks, guidance sessions, enterprise workshops and visits to/from employers**. A detailed database with all pupils' **career aspirations** allows us to carefully target our invites but most are open to all who choose to sign up. Compass + tracker tool is used to assess and monitor the needs of all learners.

Specially created **Learning for Life Careers Lessons**, spread strategically throughout the academic calendar, will take place but careers advice will be **embedded into lessons** to help pupils link their learning to the world of work.

From September 2024, the new **Alumni Network** will be utilised, fostering greater links with our former pupils to bring about new opportunities for our pupils (such as mentoring), enrich the delivery of our careers programme and allow us to proudly showcase the many wonderful achievements of our former pupils.

Pupils will receive individual careers advice in Years 11 and 13 and work experience opportunities in Year 13,9 and 10. Pupils can request an appointment through the website, via Mrs Barlow or via their Head of House. Etone College will measure and assess the impact of its own careers programme using the **Gatsby Benchmarks** and the **Compass and Tracker tool**, as well as using our own internal evaluations, including the opinions of providers, pupils, staff and parents, we also meet PALS legislation
