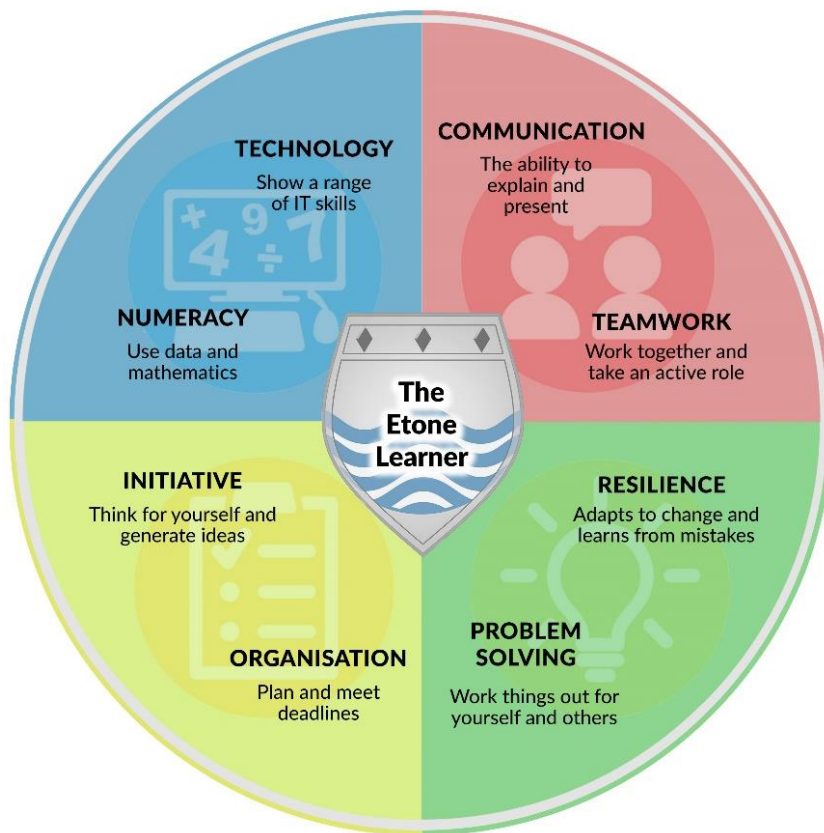

After Year 11

When you finish Year 11, you must keep learning or training until you're 18. At this point, you'll have lots of different options open to you. Some of the positives are below:

A-Levels



- Best for academic subjects (Maths, English, Science).
- Great for students who enjoy studying and prefer exams.
- Often leads to university.
- You need A-Levels for certain jobs (doctor, engineer, teacher).

BTECs

- More practical than A-Levels.
- Often coursework-based.
- Great for students who enjoy hands-on learning.
- Perfect for practical jobs.



T-Levels



- New qualification that mixes classroom learning with work experience.
- Focused on one subject area (e.g. childcare, digital)
- Good for students who want a balance of studying and hands-on learning.



After Year 11

Apprenticeships



- You have a job and earn money while still learning.
- You work four days a week and learn one day a week.
- Good for those who want to earn money while learning.

NVQs

- These focus on skills for specific jobs.
- You complete an NVQ in a workplace or college.
- You get assessed based on the work you complete rather than on exams.
